- **to establish** a wide readership within the justice system. Extensive registrations could lead to good contributions. Scripts on relevant topics would be gratefully received by the editor.
- **to respond** to the need for theological stimulus in many who are connected with victims and offenders in parts of the world where working conditions are often devastating. Colleagues who survive in such circumstances will have important insights to share with others.
